Well arrived in Cashibo

Now we were 18 weeks at the language school in Arequipa. More and more, we felt at home in the city. We also had many acquaintances made with people of different nationalities from Europe and America. It was interesting to get to know their cultures. Some of these American brothers and sisters, we have already met here in Pucallpa again. They work as pilots, mechanics or teachers at an American missionary society which is stationed very closed to us.

On July 23rd, we went on a spectacular bus trip across the Andes. We passed almost above 5000 meters above sea. At km 15, means 15km from Pucallpa, we were expected by our Padrinos, that means godfather, and their 3 children aged 5-12 and her pet, a little tame but not quite clean monkey. They took care in the first days of us and introduced us in manners and customs here at the mission.

The welcome on the station was also warmly. We found a refrigerator stocked with local specialties. Also there was an invitation list where we could enjoy good meals in the next few days and, of course, got to know our new neighbours and colleagues. We could relate a wooden house that still comes from the beginnings of this station. This mahogany wood survived this warm, moist air nearly 60 years. The temperatures in these days are at around 30-40°C with a humidity of 80-90%.

In July started the IBIENA (Name of the Bible School). Two courses are going on with about fifteen Bible students in each class. At the same time there are also carpenters mechanics and agricultural courses going on.

Students come partly from very far away. They travel up to 2 weeks on water and land. Most of these coming pastors bring his wife and children. So the school canteen serves approximately 130 people from 14 different tribes. This represents a huge challenge for the whole staff.



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Almost at the same time, on August 3ed started the school for missionary children. Our children have very quickly felt very comfortable here. They enjoy all the other children. The whole mission turns out to be their playground.

We are still arriving. Slowly we are incorporated in the various areas of responsibility. On the one hand, the idea is for two months to visit all ministries and to get a good overview. Then we will decide depending on the talent and demand in individual areas.

On the other hand we are already working with in areas where holes have appeared. Through tribal travel, home stays, holidays, illness or overload, employee flexibility is always required to cover all tasks. So Dorothea is currently working as a computer officer and is responsible for smaller and larger computer problems. Beat works temporarily at the 7th grade as a math teacher. In addition he learns to make the shopping for the Bible School kitchen. This means we go once a week at 5.00 o'clock to the fish market and buy around 100 kg of fresh fish.

We are impressed by the different trainings offered for the indigenous of the Amazon. Started with literacy courses for woman, about fish farming in the jungle, and ended with dental hygiene for children etc. It's done a huge effort from all missionaries. This reminds us of the Bible verse from Matthew. 9; 37: „The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few.“

So far our news. We are pleased that you are interested in our lives. We warmly thank all our loyal donors and prayers, who are concerned about our physical and spiritual well-being. Although we have achieved our target donation of around CHF 6000. -- per month not yet, but we know that we still blessed very rich. We feel with you very closely linked.

Gladly we hear or read from you again the latest news.

We would like to take this opportunity to introduce you to one of our students. His name is Jose Alejandro, he is 32. His wife Rosaria and 2 children Felipe 1 and Alicia 2 are with him on the station. At home, they have 2 children more. They come from the tribe of the Achuar and they spend 14 days travelling until they arrived here in Pucallpa. His village lies on the banks of the River Pastaza in the north of Peru and has 52 inhabitants. Since 5 years he worked with in his local church as a deacon. It has about 25 regular churchgoers and Jose already completed the 2ed Bible course here in Cashibo. The people in his village are still mostly self-catering, hunters and gatherers. In his spare time he likes to play football and volleyball. For that we also have here at the station soccer and volleyball. And it's used every day. Unfortunately, there is no pool, it would find certainly also very well received.
